PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I recently read an article by Debora J. Halbert regarding copyrights in quilting. Many issues were brought up regarding what copyrights entail and how patterns can be used (or not

used). I found it interesting that she found one of the most problematic aspects in defining c o p y r i g h t parameters is that quilting is a culture of transforming the ideas of others into one's own creations and building new

quilts upon the traditional models of past quilts. As quilters we share and exchange our ideas and; we use fabrics from old items and make them into something new; we take a traditional design and add our own special touch. Quilting is a culture premised upon seeing something interesting or beautiful and then working with the design to make

something new. Old and new patterns are combined, colors and materials brought together, pieces of older garments sewn into new quilts, and the modern blended with the traditional. In these ways, quilting shows the

creativity that comes forth from transformations connecting the past to the present and individuals with each other. That is why copyright boundaries are so hard to define.


