


2012 Heber Quilt Guild Mystery Quilt Step 4

Use the pieces that were made in step 3 that were printed in red ink. (You should have put them in a baggie.) There will be 4 half square triangles of color #1, #2, #3, and #4 (16 altogether) and 4 2" squares out of dark color #1, #2, #3, and #4 (16 altogether).

Make sure color #1, #2, #3, and #4 are labeled before you begin. The directions may sound confusing, but if you go one step at a time you should be fine and get the right colors in the correct places.

Take 2 color #1 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #2 2" squares. Place right sides together and **sew on drawn line**. Start on the corner that doesn't have the seam!

Match the block with the diagram before trimming and leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. **If you trim the wrong side, the pattern won't work correctly!**



Press toward larger triangle.

Repeat with all other blocks as follows: Orient them all the same as the above diagram.

- 2 color #2 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #1 2" squares
- 2 color #2 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #4 2" squares
- 2 color #4 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #2 2" squares
- 2 color #4 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #3 2" squares
- 2 color #3 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #4 2" squares
- 2 color #3 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #1 2" squares
- 2 color #1 half square triangles and pair with 2 color #3 2" squares

**Note: There will never be a color #1 paired with a color #4.
There will never be a color #2 paired with a color #3.**
