2012 Heber Quilt Guild Mystery Quilt Step 6

Cut 32 – 2" dark squares
Cut 16 – 4 ¼" light squares
Subcut once diagonally



- Take two light triangles and sew to opposite ends of a four-patch square (from step 1).
- Sew with the triangle side on the bottom to prevent stretching. Center the triangles along the side. (The corners will hang out over the edges.) Press toward the triangle pieces.



- Sew two more triangles to the other two sides of the four-patch. Press toward the triangles.
- The block needs to be squared up with a ruler that adds a ¼" seam allowance to the corners of the four-patch. The block will measure 6 ½" after it's trimmed.



- Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2" squares.
- Place the squares right sides together on each corner of the four-patch blocks. Sew a scant seam next to the drawn line (closer to the outer edge of the block). Trim the corner seam to ¼" and press toward the outer corner. Final block will measure 6 ½".
