Quilted Nametag

Make a quilted nametag to wear at guild functions.

Sew your favorite block in any size up to 5". Stitch a 1-1/2" strip of muslin or white fabric to one side of the block. This will be the place to embroider your Name, or use a Pigma Pen if you would like to write your name instead.

Cut a piece of batting and backing to the size needed. Lay right sides together and stitch around block, leaving an opening for turning.

Clip corners, turn right side out, hand-stitch the opening and attach a pin to the back. Your very own miniature quilt to wear with pride!
