QUILTER'S MATH

Many quilters say they don't "DO MATH". An inexpensive calculator is a very useful tool in your quilting studio. Here are a few math calculations and formulas that can be useful to a quilter.

+X+X+X+X+X+

The GOLDEN MEAN is a rectangle used by mathematicians and artisans for centuries. It is an 8:13 ratio. This rectangle is pleasing to the eye, and many quilts are designed using this figure.

Formula for making a quilt size pleasing to the eye

 $W \times 1.625 = L$

Desired WIDTH OF QUILT X 1.625 = PLEASING LENGTH

OR

 $L \div 1.625 = W$

Desired LENGTH OF QUILT ÷ 1.625 = PLEASING WIDTH

CIRCUMFERENCE OF A CIRCLE.. Here is the formula to estimate the amount of bias binding needed when making a round quilt.

 $Pi \times D = C$

Pi = 3.1415928

(For the sake of quilting, round to 3.15)

3.15 × DIAMETER = CIRCUMFERENCE

YARDS vs. METERS. There are 39.37 inches in a meter or in other words, a meter is 3.37 inches longer than a yard.

Formula for calculating meters to yards


of METERS \times 39.37 ÷ 36 = # of YARDS

Formula for calculating yards to meters

of YARDS \times 36 ÷ 39.37 = # of METERS

For example, if you purchase thread with 1000 meters, here is how to calculate just how many yards that is:

 $1000 \times 39.37 \div 36 = 1093$ yards of thread



QUILT MUSINGS

When you look at a piece of fabric, do the way each quilter assembles those you sometimes FEEL something inside? And finding just the right pattern to express what you feel in a physical form... it's, well.... Important.

Even if you choose the same pattern and even the same fabric as someone else, there is something magical in

patterns that are indigenous to only them.

The quilting process gives a way of expressing your thoughts and feelings that don't do as well in words. The beauty of the quilt shouts your love of it more than your words.

Taking time to guilt is as much a necessity to a quilter as breathing is to most other people. And to a quilter, no time spent quilting is ever wasted.

Search for your inner quilt with wild abandon, and express yourself!
