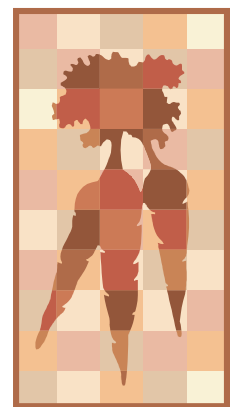
Design Challenge 2010 ~ Seeds of Inspiration
