Table Topper, 32"- 34" square

Blocks: 1 Charm Pack (at least 36 5" squares)

Sashing and Border: 3/4 yard

Five 1" or 1-1/4" x width of fabric strips

Four 3" or 3-1/2" strips

Binding: 1/4 yard Backing: 1 yard



Baby Quilt, 38" square

Blocks: 1 Charm Pack (40 squares—extras for flowers) Coordinating Border/Sashing: 1 yard

Five 1-1/2" x width of fabric strips
Five 5" x width of fabric strips

Backing & Binding: 1-1/2 yard

Small Quilt, 42" square

Blocks: 6 Fat Quarters

Cut each FQ into Six 6-1/2" squares (36 total)

Border: 1/2 yard

Four 3-1/2" x width of fabric strips

Backing: 1-1/4 yard

Binding: 1/3 yard (optional if using envelope method)
