This month's exciting guild meeting will be an opportunity for charity service as we'll be making pillowcases for the local Women's Shelter. Charity Chair, Debbie Proctor, will direct the evening's activities, but she'll need everyone's help!

Please bring two cute, fun coordinating fabrics, 1 yard each. If you have time, please cut each yard into 1/4 yd (9") and 3/4 yard (27") pieces, cut

the width of fabric. Don't worry about selvages, those will be trimmed later.

We are requesting that you bring good 100% cotton fabric. No flannels or fleece. Girls' and Boys' fabrics are both appropriate, as many of these women bring their children.

We'll be making the pillowcases assembly-line style, and learning some super-fast tricks along the way for these

three-seam, 15-minute projects. Debbie will provide the sewing machines, so all we have to do is show up and sew! (and pin and press...)

Each person will make two pillowcases to donate to the shelter. If you would like to participate, but are unable to attend, the pattern is available on the Members Only page of the guild website:
