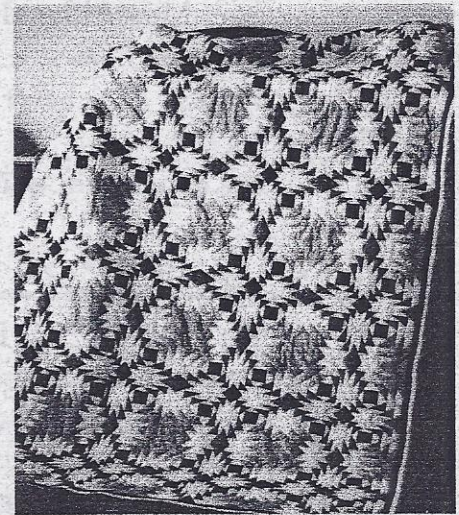

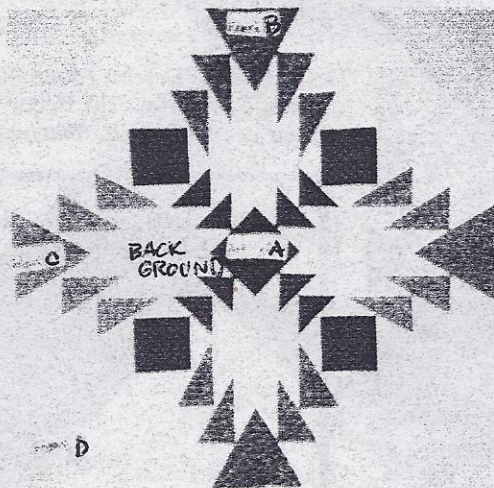

- Sewing Machine
- Sharp Rotary Cutter
- Rotary Mat
- Ruler (5 to 6" x 12 to 24")
- Iron and ironing pad/board
- 12-1/2" square is required (if you have smaller sizes, bring them also.)
- Seam ripper, scissors, pins
- Nametag
- Food Assignment

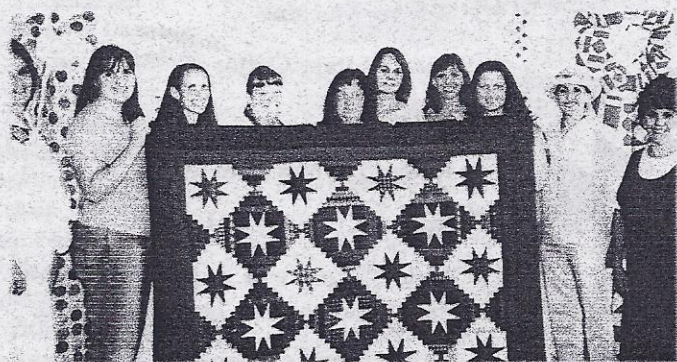
Earn money to quilt!

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Formal Garden

Size: 9" finished (9-1/2" unfinished)

Fabrics:

Yellow, beige or brown for flower center; small print or plain fabric in flower colors for petals; light background; green for leaves

Cut:

- 1 ~ 3-1/2" square for flower center
- 2 ~ 3-7/8" squares for petals
- 2 ~ 3-7/8" squares green for leaves
- 4 ~ 3-7/8" squares background

Construction:

- 1) Using the 3-1/8" squares, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of background fabric. Layer right sides together with leaf fabric. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press toward the leaf fabric. Repeat with remaining sets to make 4 half-square triangle blocks. Repeat with petal fabrics to make 4 more half-square triangle blocks
- 2) Layout according to diagram and stitch.
