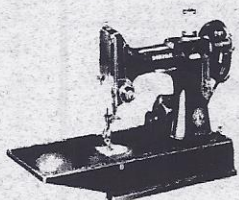


Guild Christmas Party!

Block of the Month

Maple Star

Size: 12" finished (12 1/2" unfinished)

Fabrics: You will need a light background, a medium value and a dark value

Cut from light background:

1 - 5 1/4" square, cut in half on the diagonal twice (pieces A)

4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles (pieces B)

4 - 2 1/2" squares (pieces C)

Cut from medium value:

4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles (pieces D)

Cut from dark value:

1 - 4 1/2" square (pieces E)

4 - 2 7/8" squares, cut ino half diagonally (pieces F)

4 - 2 1/2" squares (pieces G)

****Refer to diagrams below for placement.****

1. Layout pieces according to diagram.
2. Sew piece G to C and then to B.
3. Sew F pieces to A according to diagram. Then add piece D.
4. Sew together as you would a nine patch block.
