IN REVIEW—2005 March GUILD MEETING

Presentation

Michelle Blair presented a long-awaited demonstration on invisible machine appliqué. This is a quick and effective method to create a hand-appliqué look with your sewing machine. Thank you, Michelle!

PREPARING THE SHAPE

- * Cut desired shape out of cereal box cardboard or heavy card stock
- * Place right side of cardboard on wrong side of fabric; cut 1/4" bigger than shape for seam allowance. Clip curves (or use pinking shears)
- * Spray starch into a lid, then use a tiny paintbrush or Q-tip to brush starch on ¼" seam allowance
- * Press the fabric around the cardboard until starch dries
- * Pull out cardboard, and you are ready to appliqué!

(Note: this method of preparing the shape can be used for any appliqué method, including hand-appliqué.)







APPLIQUÉ

- * Pin shape into place
- * Use a small needle (10/70 Sharp)
- * Use YLI monofilament thread on top only. Use regular thread in bobbin. Adjust tension or push the thread through the little hole in the bobbin case
- * Adjust zig-zag width very small so thread just catches the edge of the shape (zig), then zags into background fabric as close to appliqué piece as possible
- * Stitch around the shape overlapping beginning stitches to secure


<< BRENDA WILCOX

MYSTERY QUILT CHECKLIST

Fabric requirements

- 1 yard background fabric (this can be light or dark as long as there is good contrast with your prints) -Cut eleven 2.5" strips selvage to selvage
 - -Bring the remaining fabric to cut at class
- √ 133 2.5" squares of print -draw a diagonal line corner to corner on 60 of them
- 6 3" squares of print

- Supplies
 O Sewing Machine
- Thread
- Scissors
- O Rotary Mat, Ruler and cutter
- O Basic sewing kit
- O Iron (optional)
- O You and your smile

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO THE CABIN

- 1 Head North out of Heber on US 40 to SR 32. At the light for SR 32, turn right.
- 2 Follow road to Francis, about 10 miles. You will pass a sign that says "Francis" and then go up a hill. At the top of the hill, there is a stop sign by the Uinta Junction Country Store. Turn left.
- 3 Follow road North through Kamas. Drive about 6 miles till you come to New Lane. There are several curve arrow signs and then the green street sign. Turn right. If you pass this road and find yourself in Oakley, turn around and go back to New Lane. This is a smaller residential road with a stop sign one block from turning off Main Street.
- 4 New Lane Road ends about 2 miles later. Turn right at the stop sign.
- 5 This road will take you into Weber Canyon. You will be driving about 7 miles to the gate. You will be getting very close when you pass a blue sign on your right that says "Hidden Lake Association, Riverside." Start to slow down. Not long afterward, you will see on your right a white sign that says "Hidden Lake Association, Mountainside." This is the gate where you need to pull off the road and stop.

The trip is approximately 45 minutes.
