

IN REVIEW—2005 SEPTEMBER GUILD MEETING


Cat Beckstead gave a demonstration on Template Piecing, with some great hints and tips for stitching those hard-to-piece blocks. Mylar plastic sheets may be used to make templates, but Cat suggests using paper templates for blocks that you will not be using over and over. Use colored pencils to shade in the color so you know which fabric to use for which template piece. Place template on right side of fabric, and cut out with rotary cutter and ruler, using paper pattern as a guide. Use a 1/6" hole punch or push pin and make a hole in your template piece at each corner. This will be used to mark the underside of your fabric pieces with a pencil to align and ensure that your



pieces fit together perfectly. Just line up the two dots as you're pinning. This method takes the guesswork out of piecing. Thanks for sharing your expertise, Cat!

WHAT'S NEW—october guild meeting

October's guild meeting will be an exciting hand-on workshop by Brenda Wilcox, who will be demonstrating Cody Mazuran's method of cottage quilt binding. This is an application of piping and bias binding. You may have seen the beautiful results on a couple of Brenda's quilts and wall hangings. Bring your sewing machine, with a regular foot AND zipper foot, basic sewing kit (scissors, pins, seam ripper, thread...), rotary cutter, mat, ruler. Prepare a quilted piece for binding, which you will keep in a reference file. Cut two pieces muslin 10" square, and one piece cotton batting 10" square. Baste, stitch or serge




edges on two sides. Mark the two other sides in a sculptured edge (see figure), then hand-baste ½" inside the marked line. Trim on the marked line. Come early to set up your machine, help sew a label on charity quilts for the Children's Justice center, and the demonstration will begin at 7:00 p.m. See you there!


2005 GUILD QUILT PROJECT— PRIMITIVE AMERICANA QUILT




































- 1 January: Paper piecing

- 3 March: Invisible appliqué
- 4 May: Embroidery
- 5 June: Chenille

- 7 August: Wool appliqué
- September: Template piecing
