P.S.

Some of you asked for the recipe for the Oatmeal bars I brought at the last meeting, so, here it is:

Vanishing Oatmeal Bars 1/2 cup plus 6 Tbsp softened butter 3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar 1/2 cup granulated sugar 2 eggs

1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

1 Tbsp maple syrup

1 3/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 tsp baking soda

1 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

1/2 tsp ground cardamom

1 cup raisins

3 cups uncooked quick oats

Preheat oven to 350 F. Cream butter and sugars. Beat in eggs, vanilla and maple syrup. Separately, combine flour, soda and spices. Stir into wet mixture slowly. Add raisins and oats. Spread mixture evenly into 9x13 METAL baking pan. Bake 20-25 minutes until light golden. Cool 3-5 minutes and remove from pan. If using a glass baking pan then reduce temperature to 325 degrees.
