State Guild News

Quilting events and activities are picking up and people are out and about. Some of the events that I am aware of that are coming up soon:

Utah Museum of Fine Arts is offering a program called Handstitched Worlds. Info was sent to everyone in early February.

March 19 is the National Quilting Day event at the Sandy Senior Center.

April 8-9 is the Gems of the Desert Quilt Show in St. George, classes, quilt show and vendors at the Dixie Convention Center

March 1, you can register for the Panguitch Quilt Walk Festival that will be held June 8-11 in Panguitch

April 8 and 9 A big quilt show in Grand Junction at the convention center.

April 8-9 is the Midway Quilt Guild retreat. It is full at this time

April 1, sign up day for the Utah Valley Retreat, which is held at the Zermatt in November. You must be a member of the guild to register.

May 19-21 is the Rusty Barn quilt/craft show at Mountain America Expo in the North Hall. They plan on around 140 vendors. There will be quilts hanging on display and possibly some demo classes. The fee at this time to get in is \$8.00

State Guild remote fest is April 2 to May 9. There will be four remote classes taught. You can watch all four at any time during this period. Handquilter is going to teach "how would you quilt this", Deonn Stott is doing an "applique" class, Emily Bailey is teaching "sunshine on a cloudy day" and Florence Evans is going to teach "Irish Jig, an easy Irish chain". If you are a state guild member, the cost is \$20 for all classes and the non-member fee is \$40. Join the guild for only \$20 for a year and then you will also get big discounts at Quilt Fest in October in Ogden.

June 10-11 is the Heber Quilt Guild retreat. There are still a few openings at this time.

The International Quilt Festival is having a show July 21-23 at the Salt Palace and this one will be open to the public. There will be vendors, classes, quilts and special exhibits. These are the same people who put on the show in Houston in the fall. This will be a smaller version of the Houston one. More details on this later as they are asking for 25 quilts

from Utah Quilt Guild members. These 25 quilts will be juried into the show.

The Springville Museum quilt show opens July 17, quilts will be juried in before this.

Tuesday, July 19, the Utah Valley Quilt Guild will hold their "July Fair" with classes, yard sale, quilts, vendors, etc. at the Bridger Event Center in Spanish Fork from 10-3.

This year, the Utah Quilt Guild will work on charity quilts for Fisher House. They are going to sell fat quarters for \$3.00 later on and ask that you make a 12 inch block to return to the guild in October and then they will make quilt tops out of them. They have people lined up to quilt them. The Fisher House is similar to Ronald McDonald House in support of the SLC VA hospital. If you feel like making an entire quilt, that would be great also. They need to be lap to large twin size. They are for all family members. The quilt can be made out of minky, flannel or cotton fabric.

There are so many local and out of state retreats being held at this time. So much information to pass on, but I will let you find out for yourselves.
