*A Preview:* As we wrap up our "out-of-the-box" lessons for the year, November's guild meeting will include breakout sessions to learn three techniques to add dimension to your quilt. All of the supplies will be provided for each technique.

They also take in children who have been trafficked and are facing homelessness. Did you know that each year in Utah more than 10,000 children are abused and neglected?


