Here are a couple of quotes from Harriet Tubman that I thought I would print out and let you decide if you want to put them on your quilt or not. I bought some fabric that had been coffee/tea dyed. I want to put my sayings on that fabric and embroider the quotes on that fabric.

My quilt will have a total of 20 blocks. I am doing 4 quotes embroidered and one quilt block that has the printable story of the Underground Railroad. I spoke with the UPS store and they told me as long as you have printable fabric that can be used in a laser printer that they could print it for us.

### Quote #1:

I was a conductor of the underground railroad for eight years, and I can say what most conductors can't say; I never ran my train off the track and I never lost a passenger.-Harriet Tubman

## Quote #2:

I had reasoned this out in my mind. There was one of two things I had a right to, liberty or death. If I could not have one, I would have the other. -Harriet Tubman

#### Quote #3

Every great dream begins with a dreamer. Always remember, you have within you the strength, the patience, and the passion to reach for the stars to change the world.-Harriet Tubman

Quote #4 This was not by Harriet but I found it so fitting for this quilt.



Other words that were embroidered on tiny pieces of fabric and place in various places on the quilt are:


Liberty, justice, freedom, United we stand, divided we fall, Equality, humanity.

The "flock" quilt block – or Birds in the air

The birds in the air are symbolic of flight and migration. A clever quilter wishing to assist the runaways could show direction simply by making one set of geese flight path distinct from the others.
