
FOUR-PATCH

CUT: TWO 2" X 9" strips, RED TWO 2" x 9" strips, BUTTER

1) STITCH one red strip to one butter strip together lengthwise. Make two sets. PRESS seams toward red.




- 2) STACK strips right sides together, alternating colors and nestling the seam allowances in the middle. PRESS well.
- 3) TRIM off one end to straighten edges. CUT stacks into four 2" segments.
- 4) STITCH each set to create four 3-1/2"4-patch units.




HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES


- CUT: TWO 3-7/8" squares, RED TWO 3-7/8" squares, BUTTER
- DRAW a diagonal line on wrong side of light squares.



 LAYER one butter square and one red square right sides together. STITCH a scant 1/4" away from drawn line, on both sides of the line.



3) CUT in half on drawn line and press toward red. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Makes four half-square triangle units.



FRIENDLY HANDS BLOCK

To complete this block, CUT: ONE 3-1/2" square RED for center

ASSEMBLE as indicated in layout below. SIGN your name and year with a permanent pigma pen on the lower half-square triangle.
