Sources say her favorite block is the Barnyard Block and her favorite colors are maroon and tan. This is a secret surprise. Please bring your block to our Christmas party on Nov. 30.

## Barnyard Block

Finished size 10" square (10 1/2" unfinished)

Cutting directions for one block:

Cut from maroon print: 2 - 37/8" squares, 2 - 27/8" squares Cut from light tan print: 2 - 37/8" squares, 2 - 27/8" squares

Cut from light cream print:  $4 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$  x  $4 \frac{1}{2}$  rectangles

Half Square Triangle Pieces:

\*\*This piece is made using the 3 7/8" squares and the 2 7/8" squares.\*\*

- 1. Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on the wrong side of squares of light tan print. Do this will all light tan squares.
- 2. Layer maroon print square with light tan square of same size, right sides together. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of drawn line.
- 3. Cut on the line.
- 4. Press toward the maroon print.

Center Square:


Using half square triangles made from the 2 7/8" squares, layout blocks using diagram.



Using a black pigma pen, sign your name in the light tan triangle as marked above.

Assemble a Barnyard Block:

Refer to diagram for placement of blocks. Half square triangles made from the 3 7/8" squares go in the outside corners with light cream rectangles on each side of center square.
