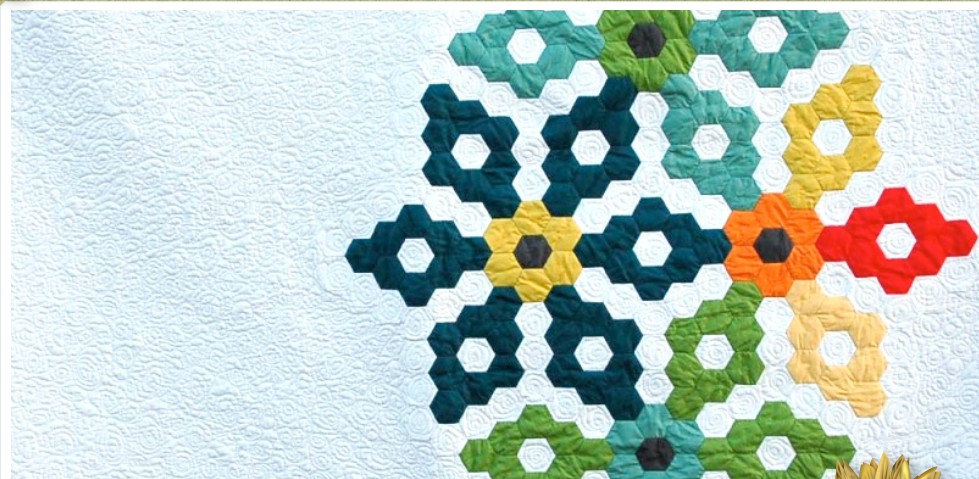


each completed nutcracker block.

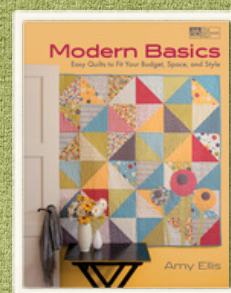
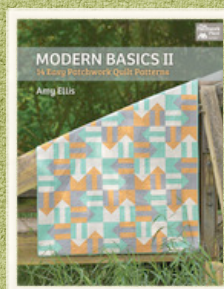
AMY ELLIS

A little about Amy from her website:

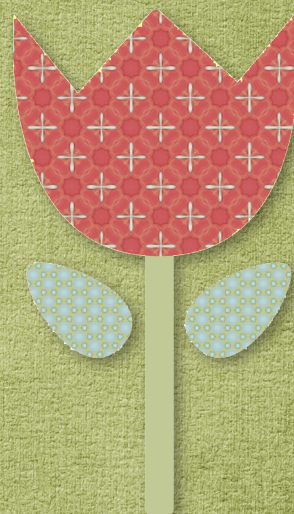

Taught by Deonn & Debbie

Test out our AccuQuilt machines to quickly die-cut perfect shapes, learn some great tips for curved piecing, then explore design/layout possibilities with these versatile block

Fabric Requirements: for Wall Hanging 28" x 28" (16 @ 7" blocks)

- 1/2 yard each of 2 contrasting (dk, lt) fabrics
- 1 yard backing/binding
- Table topper or small wall hanging, 18" x 21" (42 @ 3" blocks)
- 1 charm pack
- 3/4 yard backing/binding

(You may want to bring additional fabrics and fusible web to play with other AccuQuilt die cut applique' shapes.)

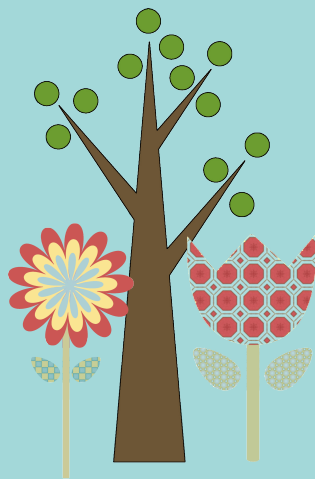
QUILT FEST
