I love complicated piecing and my favorite quilts to look at are the highly detailed appliqué and pieced quilts on the covers of Quilters Newsletter Magazine. I don't have the time to finish many quilts (don't we all say that !?)

My favorite time to quilt is 9pm-??? because it is uninterrupted.

My favorite tools are my rulers—all of them—and my bottle of spray starch. I love the feel of a crisply pressed block.

I love to do both hand and machine quilting. I get the most pleasure from precise construction and sharp points-I want to giggle and clap each time a seam presses out correctly. Ü


#### COOL TOOLS

At the guild retreat, Paulette and her sister used a special ruler to create the kaleidoscope blocks:

Marti Michell's

Kaleido-Ruler

This ruler features two different triangles that make up a kaleidoscope block: A 67~1/2° isosceles triangle for the main block of the kaleidoscope,



and a 45° angle for the corner triangles.



Here's another application for this very cool tool.



The small ruler will make blocks 2 to 8 inches, and the large ruler will make a block 6 to 16 inches.
