Design Challenge:

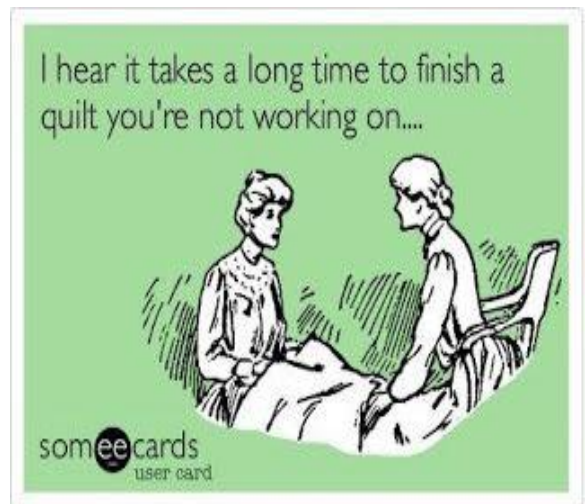
Pick a shape & 3 crayons from Ali's buckets. You can add neutrals to the colors you pick, but the colors need to be the main focus. The finished project is due at the October 2021 meeting.

Pick as many projects as you want to try and get finished this year. They just have to be Works In Progress (WIP).

You pay \$2 per project. You get \$1 back when the top is complete, the other \$1 you get when the project is 100% completed.
