# Heber Valley Quilt Guild

Are you UFO challenged?

Are you ready to complete 6 of your unfinished projects this next year?

Are you willing to put up \$1.00 for each project as a promise to complete?

To participate list on the attached sheet the unfinished projects that you would like to complete. Every 2 months the dice will be rolled and that number will correspond with a number you have assigned to a project. Example: If the number 4 is rolled in January, you will have to complete that project listed as #4 on your list by the March meeting. In March, if the #1 is rolled then you have until the meeting in May to finish the project listed as #1 on your list. You will have 2 months to complete each project.

Everyone's number six (6) will be due at the December 2020 meeting. This is a project of your choice. So, if you have a big project you would like to finish and need a whole year to finish then that is the one for your number 6 slot.

The rules are simple: A UFO is any piece of fabric, cut into for the purpose of making a quilt, wall hanging or other object of art that is made of fabric totally or partially quilted and not completed.

Completed means totally quilted, bound, labeled, and ready for use.

Sheets will be handed out/ emailed/ found online for the December meeting for those who want to participate.

Every finished UFO will get a name entered into a drawing at the end of the year for the remainder of the money.

Sheets are returned at the January 2020 meeting all filled out along with the participant's \$6.00 - (\$1 per project). Money will be collected at the January meeting.

First number chosen at the *January* meeting - project will be due in time for the *March* meeting;

Second number chosen at *March* meeting - project will be due in time for the *May* meeting;

Third number chosen at *May* meeting - project will be due in time for the *July* meeting;

Fourth number chosen at *July* meeting- project will be due in time for the *September* meeting;

Fifth number chosen at *September* meeting- project will be due in time for the *November* meeting.

**You will have one year to complete #6 on your list and bring it in for December 2020 meeting.**
