Hello Ladies,

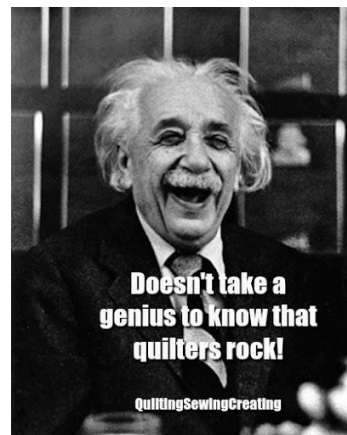
