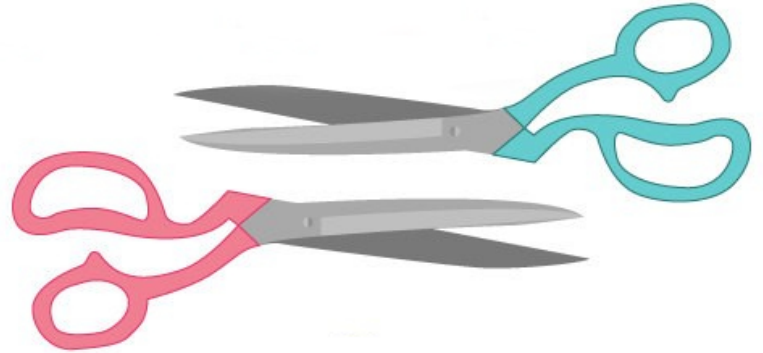

We are planning on 8 Open Sew Days for 2024, taking place at either Deonn's house or Paige's.

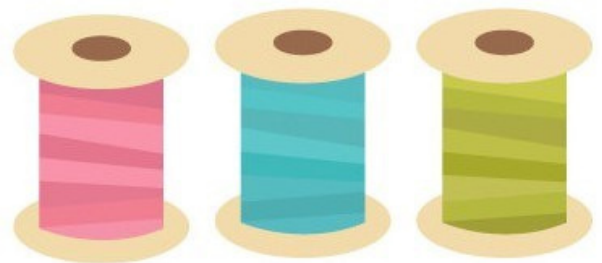
