Tall Grass

We are starting a new feature in our Newsletter. Everyone is welcome to participate. If you have read a novel that talks about Quilting or sewing, email the name of the book and some brief thoughts about why you liked the book to the guild email.

I just finished listening to the book Tallgrass by Sandra Dallas. Here is the Description from Amazon

During Word War II, a family fnds life turned upside down when the government opens a Japanese internment camp in their small Colorado town. After a young girl is murdered, all eyes (and suspicions) turn to the newcomers, the interlopers, the strangers.

This is her town as Rennie Stroud has never seen it before. She has just turned thirteen and, until this time, life has pretty much been what her father told her it should be: predictable and fair. But now the winds of change are coming and, with them, a shift in her perspective. And Rennie will discover secrets that can destroy even the most sacred things.

Part thriller, part historical novel, Tallgrass is a riveting exploration of the darkest---and best---

parts of the human heart.

I have always enjoyed reading historical novels. I think that is why this book appealed to me. It was an added bonus when the main character's mother is a quilter. Rennie is at a time in her life she she is starting to notice differences in the ways that men and women around her communicate with each other. She likes the way the women in her Mom's quilt group help others that are less fortunate and use quilting as a way to do that without making them feel like they are a charity case. Rennie also sees that the women are great friends to each other and help each other in times of need. Rennie's father calls the quilt group The Bees, and Rennie's mother the Queen bee. There are great descriptions about making quilts, and how they represent life.

At the end of the book, there was an interview with the author. Her sister is a quilter, but she isn't. sews and has a great love for textiles. She has also written other books about quilters and I look forward to reading them. I hope you enjoy this book as much as I did. I can't wait to hear about your favorite quilting novels.
