



“Sew Much Fun” HVQ 2015 Row Quilt

4 Patch Instructions

The 4 Patch Block can be used as a spacer between rows or in the border as desired. This technique is found on Lori Holt's blog, “Bee in my Bonnet”. Here is the link for the tutorial:

Start with 3 inch squares. Cut one square for every four patch you need for your row, plus 1 extra. Finished size = 2" x 2" with beautiful, accurate 1-inch squares.

The rows on our quilt are each 54 inches wide (36” for the wall-hanging size).

To make 1 row for our quilt you will need to cut: 28 (19) @ 3" x 3" squares of assorted prints. With this method you lose half a block on each end of the pieced strip.

Follow the tutorial for remaining instructions.

NOTE:

- If you want to make a different size 4 Patch Block here is the formula:

$$(FS \times 2) + 1" = \text{SIZE}$$

Finished size of each square x 2 + 1 inch = the size square to cut.

(Each square will yield one 4-patch.

Cut one square more than the number you need.)
