

Churn Dash

Size:

12 x 12" finished (12-1/2" unfinished)

FARRICS.

Select a focus fabric (A) and a contrasting background fabric (B). Cut the following:


- A) One 2-1/2" x 19" strip Two 4-7/8" squares
- B) One 2-1/2" x 19" strip Two 4-7/8" squares One 4-1/2" square for center

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1) Sew the two 19" strips together lengthwise. Press toward (A). Cut four 4-1/2" blocks.
- 2) Using the 4-7/8" squares, make four halfsquare triangles. Layer one (A) and one (B) right sides together. Draw a line diagonally

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

from corner to corner. Stitch 1/4" on either side of the line. Cut along the line. Press toward (A). Repeat with other squares. 3) Lay out blocks according to the diagram below, and sew as you would a nine-patch.
