


A GIANT Thank you to Shantelle Cox ...

living on their little farm.



BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Evening Star

Size: 9" finished (9-1/2" unfinished)

Fabrics:

- Background: 4 ~ 2-3/4" squares for corners
4 ~ 3-1/4" for background of star points
- Star Points: 4 ~ 3-1/4" medium value fabric
- Center: 4 ~ 2-3/4" squared dark value fabric

Construction:

- 1) Using the 3-1/8" squares, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of background fabric. Layer right sides together with star point fabric. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press toward the star fabric. Repeat with remaining sets to make 8 half-square triangle blocks. Trim to 2-3/4" squares.
- 2) Layout according to diagram and stitch.
