threaded needles in a case) and learned a new tip for folding beautiful fat quarters (fold in half width-wise, then in thirds, and thirds again, tucking the raw edges inside).

Deonn gave a demonstration on ideal ergonomics for your sewing room, including the correct heights for your sewing machine, cutting and pressing stations, and we added another page to our Quilter's bible.

We welcomed a few new faces including Bethany May and Becky Heslop. This year is off to a great start, and it looks like it's going to be another fun year of quilting and learning together.



What's New - FEBRUARY GUILD MEETING

HAND QUILTING BASICS & MORE

Shantelle Cox will be leading a discussion on quilt stencils, marking tools, batting, and anything else associated with hand quilting. Then she will teach how to quilt by hand.

Bring your practice project as outlined below. There will be LOTS of information, tips and tricks, so be sure to bring a pen or pencil for taking notes as well as ideas from what you have seen, heard about and used before. Lots of these ideas can be used for hand- and machine-quilting.

If you have never tried hand quilting, this is a great time to give it a try without the commitment to a large project. Who knows, you may just like it!

Hand Quilting Project:

- Cut two 13" squares of muslin, and one square of cotton/poly batting.
- Trace quilting pattern on one of the muslin squares using a water-soluble pen or other method that will wash out.
- Layer your project to make a quilt sandwich and baste with either safety pins or pale pink or yellow thread.

In addition, please bring:

- Hand-quilting thread (matching or contrasting color to see your stitches)
- ~ Thimble
- Scissors
- #8 or #9 "Betweens" needles

Shantelle will have extra supplies of thread and needles if you do not have any on hand. Please call her if you need batting or muslin.


acquired patterns into. Contact Shantelle for more details, your retreat magnet card and the retreat survey. It will be a great retreat!

Design Challenge 2007 - Charm School

The Heber Valley Quilters are going to Charm School for their 2007 Design Challenge. Classes begin February 1st and continue through June 7th. Space is unlimited and a variety of classes are being offered.

COURSE 1:

February 1st "I Can Sing a Rainbow"

Bring two sets of 12 - 6" squares to trade, selecting your colors from the rainbow. Select colorful, multi-color prints. For this round, no tone-on-tone prints. No white or black backgrounds. No solid color fabrics.

Charm School Rules:

- 1. Use only 100% cotton, quilt shop quality fabric. No fabrics from JoAnn's or Wal-Mart.
- 2. Do not pre-wash your fabric.
- 3. Cut fabric accurately and carefully.
- 4. One set = 12 6" squares. A 1/3 yard cut or 2 fat quarters is enough fabric to cut one set of squares.

5. Each set must be a different fabric.

Other courses to come:

March: "What is Black and White and Red All Over? (prints with combinations of blacks, whites, reds...) April: "Choir Practice" (fabrics that sing) May: "Study Hall" (layout and design)

June: "Final Exams" (quilt show)

Everyone is encouraged to participate in charm school. The more the merrier! If you are unable to come to guild meetings, please give your sets of squares to another guild member so you can be included in the trade. By April you will have 72 six-inch squares to make your charm quilt.
