appliqué pieces, several which have won acclaim locally and nationally. She recommends cutting away the back of your appliqué in order not to have conflicting grain lines, allowing the batting to come through

when quilting. Otherwise,

the appliqué may lay too flat and lose dimension.

Jodi gave suggestions for quilting from a judge's standpoint. Quilts are judged with two things in mind: technical qualities, and aesthetics.

Technical: Quilt lays flat, hangs straight, patchwork is accurately sewn, same size blocks throughout quilt. Borders are not too tight or too loose. Quilting is even throughout, Binding is neat, has mitered corners, and is

smooth and even.

Aesthetics: Quilt has visual appeal, contains a center of interest, is harmonious, in scale, and borders are complimentary. Color plays an important part in the aesthetics of the quilt. For added punch, add a zinger color.

Jodi suggested that we keep our standards high and practice accuracy in each step of the quiltmaking process. Thank you, Jodi, your quilts are inspiring!

What's New - APRIL GUILD MEETING - INSTANT BLOCKS

OK, girls, let's get ready to RUMBLE!

Join us for guild meeting Thursday, April 5th for a night of immediate gratification! We will be learning to make "Instant Blocks" with just a few strips or squares, a little stitching, a little cutting and viola! Hundreds of instant blocks! All the fabric is provided by the guild, and is pre-cut and ready to sew. We will be sewing in pairs, so one can sew while the other pins and presses.

Bring a sewing machine (if you can, not everyone will need one), light beige or almond-colored thread, seam ripper, pins, a mechanical pencil or your favorite marking tool, your rotary mat, ruler and cutter, and an iron and ironing pad (if it is portable).

The blocks we create will be given to the charity quilt committee. They will have sheets for us to sign-up to help layout and piece the tops, and quilt the quilts. One of the quilts will be a wall hanging for the AmBank conference room, and others will be either donated to charities or raffled during our quilt show at the library in June for a fund-raiser.

Crusann started sewing seriously a couple of years ago when she was given a hand-me-down sewing machine and found out that she was signed up for a Block of the Month quilting class.

in-law. And that brings me to what else I like about quilting. I love my "quiltin' buddy"! I have grown so much closer to her since my adventure began two years ago. I have always gotten along with her but quilting has truly become a bonding experience between us, and that means a lot. Thanks!"



Design Challenge 2007 - Charm School

CHARM SCHOOL RULES:

- 1. Use only 100% cotton, quilt shop quality fabric. No fabrics from JoAnn's or Wal-Mart.
 - 2. Do not pre-wash your fabric.
- 3. Cut fabric accurately and carefully.
- 4. One set = 12 6" squares. A 1/3 yard cut or 2 fat quarters is enough fabric to cut one set of squares.
 - 5. Each set must be a different fabric.

Our last class of Charm School will be held after guild meeting in April.

COURSE 3: CHOIR PRACTICE Fabrics that Sing - Select two fabrics that are your favorite colors and are toneon-tone prints. A tone-on-tone print reads as a solid from a distance. No solid colors, no other colors in the print, no black or white.

For those who attended Detention last month, and did not receive 24 different prints, you may want to supplement

from your stash, or swap with friends. Quilters love to swap, just ask.

Please return your quilt label sheet to Shantelle which includes the charm shape you will be using, and the name of your quilt.

Tips, Tricks & Tools

If you find your hands get tired when machine quilting, TRY THIS: Apply rubber cement to your hands and fingers. Allow it to dry before quilting and the fabric will be so easy to move under the needle.

Mary Walther (Gidget Gadget)

A visit to the office supply store is very helpful in organizing your sewing room. A letter holder works great for a ruler holder. Glue a couple of oversized clips to the bottom of a pizza box to hold blocks in place for storage. An awl or stiletto is a great tool for holding fabric pieces together and pushing fabrics through your sewing machine.
