Reverse Applique' by Cat Beckstead


*Our April Row Quilt block of the month calls for some reverse applique, and we are excited to learn this new technique from Cat.

Lose Weight Quilting - Snack Patch

Fill your cookie jar with 2 1/2" fabric squares instead of Oreos. Keep a bowl of carrot sticks on the counter. When you feel a hunger pang, go to the kitchen and treat yourself to two fabric squares, one dark fabric (chocolate) and one light fabric (vanilla). Munch on a low calorie carrot stick on the way back to your sewing machine. Join the patches to make a checkerboard baby quilt for your guild's charity project

Reach for nutritious, 100% cotton snacks. In no time at all, a slimmer you will have made an extra quilt!

The scallops, 2 windows, and door are appliqued. The rest of the house is done with templates. The two trees are paper pieced. Be sure you make copies of everything and use the insert as your original. Cat will be demonstrating reverse applique at our guild meeting...have any questions about the block ready to ask her at the meeting.

We would love for everyone to participate in the "I Spy" quilt block trading, even if you are unable to attend the retreat.

Requirements:

Two differerent character/novelty prints in bright, clear colors, fussy cut into fifteen 8" squares each for a total of 30 squares. (Ex. Frogs, mickey mouse, alligators, etc... anything that would be fun to "spy") Bring or send your squares in clear zip-lock baggies labeled with your name. No flannels, no pastels; 100% fine cotton fabrics only.

It will require about 3/4 yd if your fabric has a small overall pattern. Medium motifs may require more fabric, and large motifs may require even more fabric in order to center to the motif. (Please don't cut off Winnie-the-Pooh's legs!)

Sign up lists for food assignments will be passed around at guild meeting next week, as well as car pool surveys and driving instructions to the cabin. Wahoo! Hope everyone is planning to attend!



Freddy Moran, a well known speaker and quilter, spoke at one of the lectures. It was interesting to find out that she did not start quilting until she was 60 years old. She is now 74 and said she has made over 350 guilts. She is quite an entertaining lady and travels all over the country speaking.

The quilt shops in Durango and Dolores Golorado are well worth going to. Both have lots of displays and lots of fabric. If you ever head down that way, be sure and see them. The one in Dolores is about 10 miles off the main highway, in a very ting town. It is about 50 miles before Durango. We bought lots of fabric that was on sale for \$3 and \$4 a yard. The owner is also a very well known doll maker.

Durango Quilt Company is located at 600 N. Main, Durango. Robertson's Enterprises is on the main street, right side, just as you come into Dolores, you can't miss it. Sorry to report that there are no other quilt stores to visit alone the way, after you leave Utah Gounty. It takes about 4 hours to Moab and three hours from Moab to Durango.
