

#### Lose Weight Quilting - Stretch and Sew

For upper body work, place pin-cushion, seam ripper, and scissors barely within reach at your sewing machine. Stretch your arm full-length each time

you need a pin or tool. For lower body work, place machine foot control as far forward as possible under your sewing table. Stretch your leg out full-length to run your machine.

Sew 'til it hurts. Extend your leg fully to make your machine needle go up and down.

#### Charity Quilt Corner by Deonn Stott

Jordan Stott needed a service learning project for a class at school. As his mother, and president of the Heber Valley Quilters Guild, I thought of a perfect charity project. Jordan collected the fabric and batting from Michele Murdock that had been donated by ladies of the guild, and was able to match up and sew together 15 quilts. He then cut out batting, used spray-adhesive to glue it to the edges of the quilts, clipped the corners, turned the quilts inside-out, and machine stitched the openings closed. Then he was ready to tie his quilts, using the back-stitch method. With a total of 18.75 hours, Jordan completed ten quilts, achieved his service hours for class, and helped the HVQs with their goal to donate 24 quilts to the Children's Justice Center this year. #### The Galico Road by Barbara Murdock

Due to time restrictions, we were unable to head north to report on guilt shops, so Michele Murdock, her mom and I went to Lehi to see if we could find the guilt shop that I had been looking for. The name of the shop is Quilt'n Guzzins. It is on the west side of the freeway in Lehi. Just follow the address like you would anywhere else in Utah. All of a sudden, you say, it cant' be here, this is farmland. But sure enough, it is there, out in the fields. The address is 605 W. 900 N., Lehi. She is open 10-6 Monday Saturday.

The owner was super nice to us, despite the migraine she was having. She went out of her way to show us her shop and the huge back room where she has several long arm quilting machines, huge cutting tables, ctc. They gave us a demonstration on cutting binding on the bias. At the end of our stay, she gave me a gift for not being able to find her store the first time. This gift will go into our prize basket. All three of us ended up buying fabric, it is so hard to say no.

On the way home we stopped at The Quilting Gottage in American Fork. No changes since the last time I reported on this shop. We also stopped at a new quilting store in Lindon or N. Orem. It is in a small shopping center on the East side of State St. called South Town Mall, before you go down the hill towards Lindon. We were only able to stay a few minutes, but she did have some nice fabrics.
