As an added bonus, we were each given a "Quilter's Bible" which features charts that a quilter needs at her fingertips such as yardage requirements for backing and binding, and formulas for calculating half- and quarter-square triangles, flying geese, setting triangles and more. We will be adding to our Quilter's Bible during the coming year.

Thanks to everyone who participated by hosting, providing refreshments, or attending. It was a great success and we look forward to our next Sewing Space Showcase.

As a follow-up, here are some ideas from the book *Creating Your Perfect Quilting Space* by Lois L. Hallock. She suggests that quiltmaking is an art form; therefore, the creative space deserves the same status as an artist's studio. She focuses on ergonomics, or "human-factors engineering" which can make a difference in how good you feel during quiltmaking. Consideration of your body height in relation to your sewing machine and cutting surfaces along with easy exercises and microbreaks can mean a world of difference in energy flow. (Another good chart for our Quilter's Bible - surface heights for ideal ergonomics) She feels that an ideal sewing space has a work triangle that includes the sewing station, cutting station and pressing station. Making your work space efficient and organized will maximize your creative energy, save time and money and reduce stress, and will bring out the quilt artist that lives within you.

We look forward to a wonderful year of quilting creativity and fun. Join us on the first Thursday of each month as we review basic techniques and learn new ones that help make quilting successful and enjoyable.
