Buggy Barn Quilts

W e'd like to thank Celini Richins for her wonderful, easy-to-understand demonstration on the Buggy Barn's Stack, Slice, Switch and Stitch method. What a quick and forgiving way to learn to piece, and with easy, immediate results!

Quilters come with strings attached...

- ★ Stack fabrics right side up. (Celini stacked 7 fat quarters for each pattern piece)
- Trace pattern onto paper side of freezer paper, then iron waxy side down on top of your stack.
- **Cut** right through paper pattern, through all layers numerically in order.
- ***** Switch and rearrange prints for a scrappy look.
- *** Sew** blocks back together.
