

The Calico Road

If you get to St. George any time soon, check out the new store that Shonna Luke checked out located at the junction of Bluff and Boulevard just north of Smith's in a new shopping center. Cute place, cute stuff, innovative ideas.

Zions Retreat with the St.George Guild last month: Good trip, except for the cold weather. The quilting class was good. I went there thinking I would not be able to do it, but, after arriving, I found out I was not alone in feeling bewildered. We all learned to make the quilt and we all decided we would have show and tell five years from now. I will bring my project on Tuesday. The quilt was a two day class, the machine quilting was one day. I had more problems with machine quilting, but I can see it just takes hours and hours of practice. (free motion quilting).

Harriet Hargrave (you see her name on *Hobbs* batting products) is coming to St. George in November for a machine quilting class and a machine appliqué class. I would like to be able to go to that one.

I attended the home machine quilting show this week with my daughter, Tricia. We have some fantastic quilters in this country. One quilt was embellished with over 10,000 crystals on the front and back. There were several quilts that you couldn't decide which side was better, the front or the back.

Deonn took several classes from national teachers, and can't wait to try out her new skills.

I talked to a lady in one of the booths and stated that I saw her in Panguitch last year at the Quilt Walk Festival. She stated yes she was there and she loved Panguitch. So, she went back to the Las Vegas area, sold her quilt shop and house and moved to Panguitch and opened up a quilt shop. Her husband



quit his job and is helping her now. (she also stated that she and her husband are in therapy now. What she meant by that, I do not know!)

So, if you are ever in Panguitch, make sure that you stop in and see her store. The name of the store is the Scrappy Appleyard, located at 190 North Main. She said her summer hours will be Tuesday to Saturday, 10-6. She was so excited that I am telling my guild and friends, so pass the word!

Last month I taught a class in Midway on how fabric and thread is made, and all about the quality. I learned so much. I was the one that benefited from this class

I took a three day class in St. George from Claudia Clark Myers, a national teacher, again learned a lot about paper piecing and machine quilting. I am really thankful that I have had the opportunity to attend so many different quilting events and meet so many nice people from all over.

One of the things I have really learned from being in St. George is never be late for anything. Everyone always arrives early, and I mean early, no matter what the occasion. When it is time to start, they start. If you are two minutes late, you miss out on the food, the announcements, the program, etc. Maybe we can take a lesson from the quilters in St. George.

I am planning on going to Houston again this October. It would be fun if others in this area could also attend and see over 2,000 Quilts that are so incredible that it is hard to comprehend that people could even make them. In addition to the quilts, there are over 1,000 vendors. There are about 350 different classes that you can take, over 35 lectures, a fashion show. plus many other activities that go on. It is
