The Calico Road by Barbara Murdock

One of the most interesting things I did this past month was attend the Nancy Halvorsen lecture in SLC. Nancy is a quilter, an artist and has published many quilting books and patterns. She is also a successful fabric designer. She briefly told us a little about her life and how she got started into designing fabric. It was so interesting hearing all of the many steps involved in the process from start to finish. She stated it takes close to a year from the time she submits her drawings until the fabric is made. She rarely speaks to quilting groups because she is so busy, so it was an honor to be able to attend.

In March, I will be giving a lesson in Midway on the different kids of threads available for quilters. In my research, I was given a tour of the Superior Threads warehouse in St. George, which I found to be very interesting. The lady spent about an hour with me giving me all kinds of information. I have also visited with the distributor of DMC threads and, again, was given great information. I have learned so much.

I visited a new quilt shop in Spanish Fork this week: the name of the store is Cherry Tree Cottage at 389 South Main Street in Spanish Fork. It reminds me a lot of the Lazy Daisy store in St. George, in an old house. They just opened the middle of January and so are in



the process of acquiring more fabric. Apparently, this is the only quilting store in Spanish Fork, other than JoAnn's.

I will be attending the Zion Retreat in Zion Canyon February 17th and 18th, sponsored by the St. George Quilt Guild. I signed up for the dinner/lecture and a class on Saturday.


